Richard M. Bouhan is Executive Director to the National Association of Professional Surplus Lines Offices, Ltd. (NAPSLO). He has held this position since December 1987. As Executive Director, Mr. Bouhan is responsible for directing all staff functions, the overall conduct of the Association's staff activities and is the association's General Counsel.
